## **Healthy Eating Spotlight**

### Apple, Cinnamon & Raisin Flapjacks Makes 16

#### Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons coconut or olive oil
- 2 apples
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 175g porridge oats
- 25g ground flaxseeds
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 small handful of raisins



#### Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C and line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 2. Peel, core, and cut the apples, then blend them with a splash of water until they are a purée.
- 3. Melt the oil and honey together in a pan and add the apple purée.
- 4. Add the oats, cinnamon, raisins, and flax seeds and stir thoroughly to form a sticky mixture.

5. Transfer the mixture to the prepared tin, pressing down well until flat, and bake for around 20 minutes, or until the top is golden brown.

Allow to cool completely before cutting into squares. These freeze well. I make them in batches and pop them straight from the freezer into a snack box in the morning so they're defrosted by school break.
