<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know Van Gogh was not a famous painter until after he died. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know that computers need information to be presented in a simple and clear way. To know what to do if we have concerns about content or contact online.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand where a range of fruit and vegetables come from. To know basic food hygiene practices when handling food including the importance of following instructions to control risk e.g. What should we do before we work with food? Why is following instructions important? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know there are 7 continents and what they are called. To know there are 5 oceans and know what they are called. To recognise maps are not always to scale. To know that the UK is made up of four countries. To know that the UK is part of Europe.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know that trains have changed from steam to electric. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To learn the numbers up to 20. To know the names of 4 body parts.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know that Mozart is widely seen as the most gifted Classical (1750-1820) composer. To know that Mozart's music is usually vocal in nature (you can hum most of his music even orchestral). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know how to travel high and low in gymnastics To know how to perform a shape jump with knees bent for safety. To know how to take your own body weight on hands.

To know the ways in which we communicate effectively to achieve a group outcome in sports. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know the things that are important to your family and to you. To know and retell the Easter story.
Science	Wellbeing (RHSE)
