Knebworth School Expectations

- Children should follow our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Resilience at all times.
- Children should be in school and ready to learn every day. Please ensure you arrive promptly. Doors open at 8.40am and are locked at 8:45. Children who arrive after this time should enter via the office.
- Children should wear full school uniform including school shoes (not trainers) and long hair should be tied back.
- Reading book and reading diary should be in school every day and taken home each night. Reading books should be returned the following Monday.
- Children should be reading at home daily with family members, any reading is good reading!
- Full and correct PE kit should be worn to school on PE days (Mondays and Tuesdays).
- Children should bring a water bottle filled with water to school each day.
- Children are provided with the option of fruit at breaktime. If you do want to provide an alternative it must be a healthy option.
- If you have a query or concern, always speak to your class teacher first. This can be done via Class Dojo or (if brief) on the door at the end of the day once other children have left.

Curriculum

Maths: Multiplication and division, fractions and measurement

English: Recounts, fiction writing, significant author study (Roald Dahl), instructions, explanation texts, take one book and poetry. Reading (whole class and group), spelling and grammar skills will be taught throughout.

Science: Electricity – circuits and safety

Art/DT: Aztec Sunstone Textiles – puppet making.

Computing: Word processing, algorithms and debugging

French: Celebrations and portraits.

History/Geography: Aztecs, continents and map work.

Things to do to support your child's learning at home:

- ✓ Daily reading which is to be recorded in reading records.
- ✓ Use Numbots to support your child's addition and subtraction skills
- ✓ Learn times tables starting with 2, 5 and 10 (then 3 and 4). Children need to aim for instant recall & also learn corresponding division facts.
- ✓ Weekly spellings to support your child with the year 2 common exception words.
