On Tuesday, Miss Breckenridge took a group of children to the Stevenage Sporting Futures Team Rowing festival. The children showcased some excellent rowing skills and were awarded 4th place in the festival – well done to everyone involved!

On Wednesday, Year 6 were lucky enough to receive a presentation around the topic of Hertfordshire Lieutenancy. The children found it really interesting to learn about the King's jobs and how busy he and the other royals are. They then took part in a couple of activities/discussions which was really interesting to see which values were the most important to everyone. Unsurprisingly, education was picked by most of us!



Also on Wednesday, Jessica, Elisha, Isabelle and Ellie (our DEI Ambassadors) along with Miss Bains and Mrs Lowry visited Peartree Primary School to listen to Gary Younge speak as part of the Herts Voices programme. Gary told us all about his mum who was born in Barbados, she moved to England and Gary was born in Stevenage. He spoke to us about his siblings but also about the many jobs he has held over the years which include being a journalist, an author and most recently a professor. Gary has been a journalist for The Guardian for 28 years and has been lucky enough to interview many famous people such as Nelson Mandela, Barack Obama and Stormzy. He spoke incredibly passionately about both his journalism career and his work as a professor. He was really inspiring and he told us all about how he thinks we should work hard to do the best we can in the things we love — an important message for us

all to remember. They also let us ask questions and Elisha was overjoyed to be picked to ask Gary a question! Thank you to Miss Bains and Mrs Lowry for facilitating such a memorable opportunity for our DEI Ambassadors.

Also this week, Turing and Johnson classes visited St Peter's Church in Stevenage to learn all about the Christmas story. The children got to meet all of the important characters such as the three wise men and the shepherds and had a great time listening to them, singing and creating objects to remind them of each of the parts of the journey. Bea said 'I liked it because we got to make our crowns and meet the baby Jesus.' Thank you to the Year 2 team for organising this learning opportunity for the children.

Classes across the school today marked Protecting Our Planet Day by watching a live Ice & Oceans lesson. They learned about protecting coral and the ocean from a marine biologist before speaking to a polar researcher on board the RRS Sir David Attenborough ship! She spoke to us about the impact of climate change on the Antarctic ice, what her research on board the ship involves and took us outside where we spotted some icebergs in the Antarctic Ocean!

Healthy Eating Spotlight

Chocolate Chickpea Balls

These are a HUGE hit by everyone in our home. Don't be put off by the chickpeas! They add moisture and texture and are rich in fibre and plant-protein. You don't taste them at all in this recipe.

Makes 14 large ones (you could also make more smaller ones)

Ingredients:

- 1 can chickpeas, drained
- 60g oats, ground to a flour in a food processor
- 125g nut butter (or tahini if you have a nut allergy)
- 100g honey (or maple syrup if vegan)
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 1/8 tsp Salt
- 100 grams Dark Chocolate chips
- 200 grams Dark Chocolate

Method:

- 1. Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 2. Add the ingredients except the chocolate and chocolate chips to a food processor. Process until smooth.
- 3. Add the chocolate-chips to the dough and stir to combine.
- 4. Roll the dough into balls and place on the baking tray. I used a tablespoon amount for each ball. Transfer to the freezer for 30 minutes.
- 5. Melt the chocolate (I use the microwave) then dip the chocolate balls in the melted chocolate until fully coated. Return them to the tray. Place in the freezer for another 15 minutes.

Note, this recipe contains nuts so cannot be taken into school.
