**Message from the Senior Leadership Team**

Dear Parents and Carers,

There has most definitely been a chill in the air this week therefore we would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that as we move into the winter months at school all children should have a jumper/cardigan and/or coat in school to keep them warm.



This week the children have been discussing Remembrance Day in both assemblies and in their classes and they have been learning that soldiers from all around the world with different backgrounds help to keep us safe. Lots of children have made poppies to mark this occasion and the children in nursery have also created a poppy soldier which is proudly on display in their nursery. Miss Bains also had the pleasure of hearing Ellie in Dahl Class read her beautiful poem to her class on this topic. On Sunday, our Head Boy Jake and Head Girl Ruby along with Ann (one of our school governors) will be laying a remembrance wreath on behalf of the school as our thanks to all those who have kept and do keep us safe.

On Tuesday, children from Reception to Year 2 had the opportunity to join in with a professional drama group called Perform. The theme was 'Around the world' and the children journeyed into faraway lands and they were taught to how to say 'hello' in the countries they visited. We had lots of comments from the children saying "It was the best day ever!" Also, on Thursday, Year 2 enjoyed their Great Fire of London workshop where they recreated the fire using ribbons and enjoyed using drama to re-enact this historical event. The children have then worked exceptionally well on writing a recount linked to this experience and we have been so impressed with their writing. A BIG thank you to the Year 2 team for organising this wonderful opportunity for the children. Keeping with the writing theme Year 3 have also been working brilliantly this week on writing instructions for making jam sandwiches and have worked hard to ensure they use all of the features of this text type – well done all! Also, Miss Bains has thoroughly enjoyed reading all 32 stories that have been submitted for the BBC 500 Words story competition. Thank you to each and every child who took part – your story was an absolute pleasure to read.

On Wednesday children across the school took part in a virtual *School of Kindness* workshop where they discussed the qualities of kindness, why it is so important and looked at the definition of empathy and why this is a superpower! They also learnt about the science of kindness and the impact this has on our physical and mental health. As part of this workshop the children then took part in a kindness challenge which involved them spreading kindness across the school and many members of staff received personalised messages of kindness which most definitely brightened up their day. A BIG thank you to *52 Lives – School of Kindness* charity for facilitating this inspiring workshop - there was a real buzz around school for being kind to one another!

Last week some Year 6 children participated in the Stevenage Schools Basketball festival. Every child played really well showing some fantastic basketball skills and this was a very competitive festival with some close games. Well done to the children for receiving the school games value award of respect. This week, some Year 5 children attended the first ever Stevenage Schools Benchball festival. This was a very fast paced and tactical festival where all of the children adapted well and got involved with the games and all of the teams were closely scored in the final table. Lastly, the Year 5 Sports Ambassadors have been out every lunchtime leading games for the children which has been so positively received – well done! A BIG thank you to Miss Breckenridge for facilitating all of these opportunities for the children.

A BIG well done to Maia A, Maisie, Sienna, Rosie, Lewis and Cody in Year 5 who ran a very successful stall selling bracelets and as a result have raised £80 for the charity *Make a Wish!* Well done for showing such responsibility – we are all so proud of you.

## Healthy Eating Spotlight

*Did you know our wonderful catering team (Herts Catering) make all the Friday lunchtime pizzas from scratch on site each week? Here is the recipe if you would like to make this at home!*

### Chia Jam

This jam takes 10 minutes to make and requires just 3 ingredients. It's thickened with chia seeds, which provide healthy omega 3 fatty acids, fibre, and calcium. It's also much lower in sugar than shop-bought jam. Delicious with toast and nut butter or yogurt!

Makes: 1 large jar

Ingredients:

- 1 bag of frozen berries (blueberries, raspberries and cherries work well)
- 3 tbs honey or maple syrup
- 3 tbs chia seeds




Method:

1. Add the berries and honey/maple syrup to a pan and simmer for 5 minutes, then mash the berries with a potato masher or fork. I like to leave some whole berries there for texture.
2. Add the chia seeds and simmer for a further 5 minutes. Pour the jam into a large jar. This will keep in the fridge for one week.

This week we discussed and shared the following resource from Diverse Educators. We discussed that as a school we are continuing to embed all of the work undertaken last year in this area and building on this within this year.




## This Week's Book Recommendation
