

Healthy Eating Spotlight

A big thank you to Caroline Farrell (Registered Nutritionist) for providing our weekly healthy eating spotlights!

Healthy Breakfast Ideas

Studies have shown that children who eat a balanced breakfast tend to perform better academically and can be less irritable. Aim for a combination of carbohydrates such as oats or bread with protein such as milk, yogurt, nuts, seeds, or eggs.

Here are some examples:

- 1. Low sugar cereal (e.g. Weetabix or Oatibix) with milk. We like to add sprinkles (mixed seeds!) on top for added nutrients.
- 2. Wholemeal bread toasted with a source of protein such as nut butter or scrambled eggs.
- 3. Plain Greek yogurt layered with fruit and granola (such as Lizzie's low sugar granola).
- 4. Porridge made with milk and fruit. Top with some chopped nuts or seeds.
- 5. Overnight oats. See recipe below.



Overnight Oats

This serves one but these keep in the fridge for up to 5 days so can be batch-made to save time on busy school mornings!
Ingredients:

- ½ cup oats
- ½ cup your choice of milk
- ¼ cup plain Greek yogurt or soya yogurt
- 1 teaspoon maple syrup or honey
- 1 teaspoon chia or ground flaxseeds
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 handful of berries (frozen raspberries or cherries well)



Method:

Simply add all the ingredients to a jar and mix well. Pop the lid on and leave in the fridge overnight.

My girls love theirs topped with dark chocolate shavings (use a vegetable peeler to shave them).




This Week's Book Recommendation
