

#### Halloween Chocolate Apples

These chocolate apples are so easy to make and a lovely half-term Halloween activity to do with little ones.

#### Makes: 4

Ingredients:

- 4 apples, washed and dried
- 4 lollipop sticks
- 200g good quality dark chocolate (I used Lindt 70%)
- Sprinkles you could use desiccated coconut or chopped nuts to make these healthier, but my little ones insist on sprinkles!

#### Method:

- 1. Line a baking tray.
- 2. Break the chocolate into chunks and melt in the microwave.
- 3. Push a lolly stick into each apple.
- 4. Dip the apples into the melted chocolate then scatter sprinkles on them.
- 5. Place them on and baking tray and pop in the fridge to set. This takes about 20 minutes.


#### Isla in Turing Class recommends ...


