### **Healthy Eating Spotlight**

A big thank you to Caroline Farrell (Registered Nutritionist) for providing our weekly healthy eating spotlights!

#### Halloween Creepy Crawly Spiders

These creepy crawly energy balls are easy to make and perfect for a healthy Halloween treat.

Makes: 10 Ingredients:

- 3/4 cup Pitted Dates
- 1/4 cup Oats
- 3 tbsps Peanut Butter
- 1 tbsp Cocoa Powder
- 1 tbsp Honey
- Pinch Salt
- 30g Pretzels (round parts chopped into legs)
- 20 Edible Eyes or Dark Chocolate Chips



#### Method:

- 1. Add the dates, oats, peanut butter, cocoa powder, maple syrup, and salt to the bowl of a food processor. Run the food processor until the mixture forms a ball.
- 2. Form the mixture into small balls with your hands, using roughly one tablespoon of dough per ball. Place the pretzel legs into the balls on the sides and place the "eyes" into the balls to form eyeballs.

Note, this recipe contains nuts therefore these cannot be brought into school. You can replace the peanut butter with tahini for those with nut allergies.

This is a beautiful book that captivated me so much that I finished it in two sittings and I knew I just had to recommend it to our parents, pupils and staff at Knebworth School. It's about a 10 year old boy on his journey into Year 6 and secondary school. It deals with all kinds of themes such as friendships, family, bullying, grief, redemption, writing, art - and Skellig. What made it stand out to me is the way it has been written in free verse, with such carefully selected words and phrases that keep you hooked. There are also some excellent illustrations too. A must read for parents and pupils in Year 5 and 6.
