This week has been a hive of activity in school! In Nursery the children have been exploring their *No Outsiders* book, Hello, and focusing on the different ways in which they can say hello. In Year Two the children have used their computing skills that Miss Bains taught them last year to create their very own robots on Google Canvas. Chocolate-Chip Banana Cookies Recipe

My girls love these cookies. They taste delicious, contain just five ingredients and are super- easy to bake. They are low in sugar due to the natural sweetness from the ripe bananas. The oats add fibre, which helps to keep you fuller for longer. The dark chocolate is a great source of antioxidants, which may support our immune system. Perfect for a healthy after- school snack. We love to bake them when we need to use up over-ripe bananas! Makes 12

Ingredients:

2 ripe bananas



- 2 tbls coconut oil, melted
- 3 tbls honey (or maple syrup)
- 200g oats
- 50g dark chocolate chips (or raisins)

Method:

1. Preheat the oven to 170°C. Line a baking tray.

2. Mash the bananas then mix with the oil, honey and oats. Leave the mix to sit for around 10-15 minutes. This makes it easier to shape.

3. Stir in the chocolate chips then hand-roll the mix into balls. I use about 1 tbls mix for each cookie.


4. Pop them onto the baking tray and flatten a little into a cookie shape. Bake for around 15-20 minutes until golden.
