

Healthy Eating Spotlight

Cauliflower Macaroni

One of my girls' favourite dinners and a great way to include cauliflower in your little one's meals without them tasting it. Ingredients:

- 350g macaroni pasta
- 1 medium cauliflower cut into florets
- 1 vegetable stock cube
- 200ml milk
- 150g grated cheddar cheese
- 1 tbsp butter
- ½ tsp dijon mustand





Method:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200c.
- 2. Cook the macaroni according to the package instructions.
- 3. Cut the cauliflower into small florets. Place in a saucepan with the stock cube and cook for 5 minutes.
- 4. Once the cauliflower has cooked, drain it and add to a blender, along with the milk, 100g of the grated cheese, butter and dijon mustard. Blend until all the ingredients have combined to a sauce consistency.
- 5. Drain the pasta and return it to the saucepan. Add in the cauliflower sauce and mix well.
- 6. Transfer the pasta into one large baking dish. Sprinkle the remaining 50g cheese on top.
- 7. Bake in the oven for 15 minutes until the top is crispy.
