On Thursday we celebrated World Book Day in school. Thank you so much to parents and carers for the effort put into the children's outfits- the children all



Healthy Eating Spotlight

A big thank you to Caroline Farrell (Registered Nutritionist) for providing our weekly healthy eating spotlights!

Almond and Coconut Bites

These bites taste like Bounty Bars. Quick to make and so delicious.

Makes: 24 Ingredients:

- 200g almonds
- 2 tbls maple syrup
- 2 tbls coconut oil
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 100g desiccated coconut
- 200g dark chocolate
- Pinch of salt



Method:

- 1. Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 2. Add all ingredients, except the dark chocolate, to a food processor and process well until you get a dough-like consistency.
- 3. Press the mixture into the baking tray and pop in the freezer for 15 minutes while you melt the chocolate (I use a microwave to melt mine).
- 4. Take the mixture out of the freezer and cut it into 24 little bite-size pieces. Using two forks coat each piece in the melted dark chocolate then set aside on another baking tray.
- 5. Pop the bites back into the fridge to set. They keep well in the fridge for a few days but mine go immediately!
