# **Healthy Eating Spotlight**

#### Mini Aubergine Pizzas

Aubergine as a pizza base is such a great way to introduce little ones to a new vegetable.

Serves 4

#### Ingredients:

- 1 aubergine
- 1/4 cup Olive Oil
- 3/4 cup Tomato purée
- 1/2 tsp Oregano
- 125 grams Mozzarella Ball (grated)
- 2 tbsps Basil Leaves (finely chopped)

## Method:

- 1. Cut the aubergine into equal slices about 1/2 inch thick. Generously brush each side of the aubergine with the oil and season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Heat a large non-stick pan over medium heat. Cook aubergine in batches until tender and browned about 3 to 5 minutes per side.
- 3. Transfer the browned aubergine slices to a baking sheet and top each with tomato purée, dried oregano, and grated Mozzarella. Grill the aubergine pizzas for 3 to 5 minutes until the cheese is melted, bubbly and browned.
- 4. Top with fresh basil.
