Seasonal Spotlight - Rhubarb

Rhubarb, often mistaken for fruit, is a vegetable currently in season in the UK. It's not just its unique taste that makes it special; rhubarb is also a powerhouse of antioxidants such as anthocyanins and polyphenols, offering protection against chronic diseases like heart disease and cancer. One of our favourite ways to enjoy rhubarb is in a delicious low-sugar crumble, which has become a staple in our home.

Easy Low-Sugar Crumble Serves 6 INGREDIENTS

- 600 g (8 10 stalks) rhubarb diced into 5cm chunks
- 2 tbsp honey / maple syrup
- 150g self-rising flour
- 40g porridge oats
- 60g sugar
- 1tsp of ground cinnamon
- 100g coconut oil

METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- 2. Spread the rhubarb in a baking dish and drizzle with the honey or maple syrup.
- 3. To make the crumble topping, combine the flour, cinnamon, sugar, and oats in a bowl.

Add the coconut oil and use your fingertips to work it into fine crumbs.

- 4. Sprinkle the crumble mixture evenly over the fruit.
- 5. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until the topping is golden brown.
- Enjoy!
