Plastic Free Healthy School Snacks

To help reduce our environmental footprint, I've been asked to share some ideas for healthy school snacks that are free from single-use plastic. Here are some ideas that are nutrient-dense and affordable. They are also nut-free and egg-free.

- 1. Whole fruits like apples, bananas and satsumas are convenient, portable, and naturally packaged in their own skins! Serve with some cubes of cheese for a more filling snack.
- 2. Homemade energy balls, flapjacks or saoury muffins are quick and inexpensive to make. Bake in batches, freeze, and pack them straight from the freezer. They will defrost by break time.
- 3. Slice carrots, cucumbers, and peppers into sticks and serve with hummus.
- 4. Combine dried fruit like apricots, raisins, and cranberries with seeds such as pumpkin seeds and sunflower seeds.
- 5. Layer yogurt with granola and berries in reusable jars or containers. Choose yogurt sold in larger tubs to minimise plastic packaging.
- 6. Pair wholegrain crackers or breadsticks with slices of cheese.



Tip: Ikea do affordable stainless steel snack boxes. Lunchbots bento-style snack boxes are pricier but a good solution for separating foods e.g. vegetables with a dip. Also, beeswax wraps are a good alternative to cling film.
